Safer crossing spots are locations where you can see far in both directions. This also enables cars to see you. Lead by example and always use crossing facilities where available.

Safer


- Zebra crossings
- Pedestrian refuge islands
- Traffic lights

Not as safe

- On a blind corner
- Near the top of a hill
- Near or between parked cars

Zebra crossings

These crossings are marked by striped white lines. They provide pedestrians with a safer place to cross the road. Pedestrians have right of way, but must still look both ways and make eye contact with the driver before crossing.



Message to Drivers


