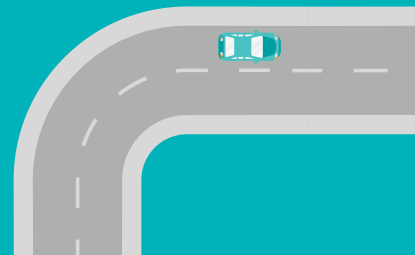


Drive: the official starting place to get your students ready for their learner licence.

DRIVE

Drive was developed by NZ Transport Agency Waka Kotahi and ACC to support young people to become safe, skilled and licensed drivers.



The Drive Road Code on the website has fun interactive units for students to work through. The units have been designed specifically for young people to teach them the road code and safe driving behaviours.

Students can use Drive on their own device or as a group.

If students create their own account, they'll be able to track their progress and unlock real learner licence practice tests.

How to use Drive in your school

Gateway class

Support students to learn the road code by giving them time in class to work through the online Drive Road Code units.

Teacher aides

Teacher aides can work with students individually or in small groups to help them with the online Drive Road Code units.

School library

Encourage students to sign up to drive.govt.nz and complete Drive Road Code units independently at home or in the library. Put up posters or bookmark the Drive website on the library computer.

School intranet

Add [Drive.govt.nz](https://drive.govt.nz) to your school intranet so students can have quick access to the Drive Road Code units.

Form/whānau class time

Support students to learn the road code by giving them time in class to work through the online Drive Road Code units.
